welfare asking the relief recipients
be given Bread tickets from Christian
Bakery & milk tickets from
Martin's milk - Granted.

June 9 - Letter sent to Nigrier
Co asking that if they locate here
coloured help be employed.

July 27 - 33 - 5 girls were sent
to Camp Y.W.

Nov - 9 - 33 - Group of women
assisted in U.O.N & Red Cross
drive for funds -

Nov. 8 - 34 - Mr. A. Lungy
brought up about Frederic Turner
under death sentence at Chatham
asking a petition for clemency -
Petition sent & clemency granted

Feb 11 - 37 - A committee ^{slaughter-house - petitioned} ^{against}
