Going back a few months, to bring myself up to date. I have been pretty busy doing different things, almost like a lost soldier over here at time.

The winter around Verdun was beautiful in France just like a picture in a Art gallery. The season change very slow over here and mother nature show all his beauty in color. It was hard and cold but it was all over the last of January, it was very sunny

The winter broke up so early in the season to our winter.

On the Sunday I went to Mass in a little bunch village near our fort. I didn't know what the priest was saying, but I was there. The bunch people as always will dress up. They was out in full colors.

Over here in Sumner we don't fraternize with the Sumner people. If its entertainment they want we entertain the Sumner soldiers with hot lead when we find them outside of barbed wire inclosures and that's that.

Well how are you these days, fine hope. One of the girls wrote me and told me about her being discharge from the army. I was glad to hear that. You willnt have to worry about him coming over here.

I'm a little tired, but okay. It look like the war is just about over, over here. It look like we will have to come home the long way around.

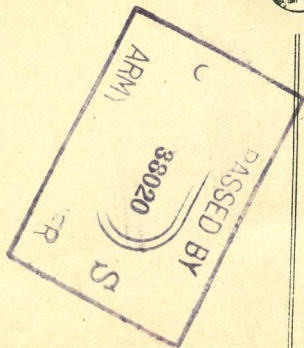

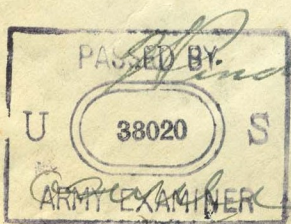
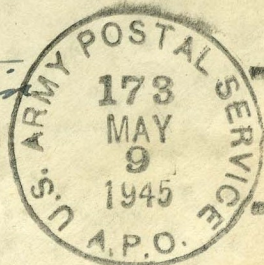
