maybe she didn't get them. but I hope
so. It was too bad about Tommy too. I
am trying to get a picture of his grave to
bring home with me. for Mrs Vincent.
with his name and number on the cross
that is on his grave. so if you see her please
tell her for me. give my regards to all
hoping to see the town again soon.
