oither above human or below human. Drama - everything is very human - without gods or devils. Comedy - everything is rational, reasonable. Vaudeville - everything is unreasonable, improbable. Clewn - nothing human about it - opposite to tragedy - no longer human - the devil in heaven or the angel in hell. In comedy everything is true and rational. Funny but absolutely serious. It has a great deal of implication in it. In vaudeville it is a wrong psychology. The result of the action is never rational or reasonable.

In the scene, The Stronger, (Strindberg) the atmospheres are: 1. Friendliness. 2. Growing suspicion. 3. Jeal-ousy. The objective for one character is "I want to hide my real feelings," and for the other woman "I want to know the truth."
